Who can apply?

Applicants seeking continued education who are able to explain how their current education goals will benefit the economy, culture, and/or environment of the Copper River watershed (for example, pursuing a degree in resource management, business management, tourism/hospitality, education, public policy, environmental science, GIS, hydrology, etc.). Extra points will be awarded to those who are current members (individual or family) of the Copper River Watershed Project (CRWP) and who have participated in volunteer activities that benefit the watershed.

Scholarship Award Information

A total of two \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to **one** graduating student from an upriver school (Glennallen, Kenny Lake, Slana High Schools) and **one** graduating student from the downriver school (Cordova High School). Homeschool students in the region are also eligible to apply. CRWP scholarships are a one-time award, and money will be sent directly to the educational institute to which you will be attending.

Selection for Scholarship Awards

Committees made up of CRWP board members and community members from up and downriver communities will review the applications using uniform review criteria (see pg. 4 of application packet). Judging is based on application only, and personal associations or prior knowledge of any applicants are not taken into consideration. A committee of downriver representatives will review upriver applications, and a committee of upriver representatives will review downriver applications. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

Application and Award Timeline

April 9, 2010—Applications must be **postmarked, submitted directly** or **emailed** to the CRWP office no later than April 9th, 2010. Applicant will be notified by the scholarship contact (email or phone) to confirm when application is received.

Downriver scholarship award:

May 15, 2010—Award announced during the Cordova High School graduation ceremony.

Upriver scholarship award on one of the following dates:

May 12, 2010—Award announced during the Kenny Lake High School graduation ceremony.

May 19, 2010—Award announced during the Glennallen High School graduation ceremony.

May 13, 2010—Award announced during the Slana High School graduation ceremony.

How to apply:

The following is a checklist of required application materials that must be submitted in order to be considered for a CRWP scholarship. Remember, incomplete scholarship applications will not be considered. All materials will be held strictly confidential and only viewed by the scholarship contact and review committee. Typed and legible, handwritten submissions will be accepted, and both electronic or hard copy submission will be accepted.

- **Cover Page:** complete the required fields on the next page.
- **Resume:** Your resume should give a detailed explanation of your objectives, skills, education, employment, hobbies and interests and should include any work experience, volunteer work, or extra-curricular activities you have participated in.
- **Letters of Recommendation:** Attach **2** recent letters of recommendations from your teachers, advisors, coaches, mentors, or persons whom you have worked with. Letters must describe your character and likelihood to pursue and succeed in a field that will positively affect the economy, culture and/or environment of the Copper River watershed.
- **Essay:** Write an essay that addresses the following (*minimum of 1 page, no more than 2 pages; if typed, no smaller than 11 point font*):
 - ✓ What in your life has influenced you to want to pursue continued education?
 - ✓ What degree do you plan to pursue and how will it have a positive effect on the economy, culture, and/or environment of the Copper River watershed?
 - ✓ Explain how living in the Copper River region has led to your decision to pursue this field of study.
- **Transcript:** Attach copies of your most current high school transcript that includes your GPA. If your transcripts are not available at the time of submitting your application, print out an unofficial transcript and have your advisor or guidance counselor sign them.
- **Letter of Acceptance:** Please attach copies of acceptance from college/school/university/vocational institute.

NOTE: In the event no qualified applications are received from each region (upriver/downriver), the Committee reserves the right to forego awarding one or more scholarships in a given year, or to award more than one scholarship to qualified applicants from one region.

Scholarship Review Criteria

1. Application Presentation—10 points

- a. Were all required documents submitted on time?
- b. Is the application coherent and with correct spelling and grammar?
- c. Are all components current and up to date?

2. Applicant Grade Point Average (GPA)—10 points

- a. Based on cumulative Cordova High School GPA score

3. Letters of Recommendation—10 points

- a. Do they provide insight into the applicant's skills?
- b. Do they provide insight into the applicant's likelihood of success in a field that will positively effect the economy, culture and/or environment of the Copper River watershed?
- c. Do they support the applicant as a suitable recipient of a scholarship?

4. Essay—45 points

- a. Is it within the required 2-page length?
- b. Is it written using correct grammar, sentence structure, spelling, etc?
- c. Does it address the following points:
 - ✓ What in his/her life has influenced him/her to want to pursue higher education?
 - ✓ What degree does he/she plan to pursue and how will it have a positive effect on the economy, culture, and/or environment of the Copper River watershed?
 - ✓ Explain how living in the Copper River region has led to his/her decision to pursue this field of study.

5. Overall Impression—20 points

- a. Is this student involved in diverse community activities?
- b. Has the student demonstrated their commitment to the Copper River watershed and its resources through participation in extracurricular and volunteer activities?

6. Current member (individual or family) of the Copper River Watershed Project—5 points
